PERMA APPROACH FOR CYFARTHFA STUDENTS

The PERMA approach represents five core elements which underpin our values:

Positive Emotion: is one of the cornerstones to well-being. Kindness, gratitude, hope, contentment are all positive emotions that contribute to the "pleasant life."

Engagement: much like positive emotion, is a subjective element to wellbeing. Engagement is about being totally absorbed (in the flow) by a present task where time and self- consciousness seem to cease.

Relationships: Relationships are fundamental to wellbeing. Create and maintain harmonious, fulfilling relationships.

Meaning: in life comes from serving something that is bigger than self. To have a sense of well-being, finding a purpose in life is essential. Altruism and philanthropy are good methods to establishing a meaningful life. **Achievement:** is a sense of accomplishment. Having goals and meeting those goals, improves your well-being and allows you to flourish.
